A Message from Shropshire Council

The Coronavirus outbreak has disrupted our lives in ways which, even a month ago, we couldn't imagine possible. My thoughts are with the many families who have already been affected by this horrible disease. I also wish the Prime Minister well, who at the time of writing I know is battling hard to fight off the disease himself.

I am pleased that all Shropshire Council councillors are actively sharing information between themselves to help the situation county-wide. I pay tribute to colleagues who work in Shropshire Council, in particular many colleagues who have been taken away from their 'normal' roles and are quickly retraining into new roles directly involved with the Coronavirus emergency.

Before this crisis is over, many more of us will have to depend on our heroic health service for assistance. The bravery of our NHS and Social Care staff is truly inspirational and we must do all we can to support them. Staying at home, reducing contact with others, washing our hands and shopping sensibly are all simple but effective measures we can take to stop the spread of the virus, protect the vulnerable and the NHS.

I have been heartened by the overwhelming response from local charities and local community organisations during this crisis. All 6 Parishes in our ward of Burnell have been looking out for each other in an extraordinary way. Self-help groups have been established organically, and this highlights the community spirit we all have. As we are well aware, the impact of Covid-19 is economic too. The Government's new packages of COVID-19 support funding are welcome. The Self-Employed Income Support Scheme and the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme have steadied the fears of many wage earners. Businesses have also begun to apply for loans through the Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Scheme (CBILS). I also pay tribute to all the essential service businesses throughout Burnell who have continued to work, and indeed adapted their ways of working, to help ease this situation.

There is a huge amount of information available everyday about the latest situations with regard to Coronavirus. I would urge people to sign up to the various social media groups on Facebook and NextDoor where this information is widely shared.

Shropshire Council (SC) has also launched new Community Reassurance Teams (CRTs), and a new dedicated Helpline, during the Coronavirus pandemic, to help those who are vulnerable and in need of help. <u>The Helpline is 0345 678 9028</u>, and is available from 8am to 6pm week-days, and 9am to 1pm Saturdays. Each caller will be asked to explain their need and, if required, this information will be passed on to the appropriate support. (The Council's new Helpline cannot provide Coronavirus health advice or other health advice, and SC will direct people to go onto NHS 111 online, as per Public Health England, if this is what is needed).

The CRTs are a new key service which have been created to work across the county with our communities in an effort to co-ordinate support for local residents, including businesses, with the support of town councils, parish councils, voluntary groups and community groups. I have been in constant contact with the CRT officers for Burnell, and I have ensured that they know of all the groups that have sprung up. Please do stay safe, stay at home where possible and protect the NHS.
